The power of investing in the parents of our students was one of the most important things we learned in 2020. Our staff spent more time listening and talking with parents last year than ever before. We've always known that our students' parents want the best for their kids, but 2020 taught us that these amazing parents will rise to the challenge when they're confident and equipped with the resources they need to be successful.

When our students began digital learning at home in March 2020, we quickly realized there were several barriers to their success. The biggest one was the lack of access to devices (in March, most of our students were doing their schoolwork on smartphones). So in May, thanks to the generosity of many donors, we were able to purchase 527 brand new Chromebook computers — one for every family in our **programs!** In addition to giving away these computers, our staff met individually to teach the parents of our students how to use them to check their child's grades, access online literacy programs, and do schoolwork. Using their new computers over the summer, our students read over 100,000 minutes online!
